

**GREATER LINCOLN SERTOMA DISTRICT
PAC MEETING
MAY 19, 2008**

Club Presidents for the Greater Lincoln Sertoma District met with District Governor Lee Arellano on Monday, May 19, 2008. The meeting was called to order at 5:30PM with the following in attendance:

Minutes from the last meeting were read and approved.

District Treasurer Suzanne Frasier reported a current balance of \$3296.72. Most of the expenses have been paid from Regional convention. Motion made by Neal Thomas to approve the report and seconded by Fran Follett. Report will be place on file for future audit.

Lee ask for a membership report. Gateway and Northeast both reported gaining one new member. Mid-Towne has a possibility of a new member soon.

Lee reported that the Stars & Stripes Club did receive the District Bulletin Award but did not receive anything at Regional. Lee did congratulate Stars & Stripes, Northeast, and Mid-Towne for all having excellent club bulletins.

CLUB REPORTS

Gateway = Johnny Robinson reported members are busy working on the golf tournament that will be held June 6th at HiMark Golf Course. The installation banquet is set for June 26th. He also reported on a new restriction that will be applied for the Oktoberfest. Vendors will be allowed to only use three ounce cups. If anyone is seen with a larger cup, undercover officers will shut the event down.

Stars & Stripes – Harland Parrish reported they are busy working on the flag project. Contracts can be found on the website = www.sertoma.adoptaflag.com. The cost is \$35.00 and June 1st is the deadline. Next year the club is looking at getting involved with the National Guard for a Salute to Veterans to be held at Mahoney Park. Some members will be attending a program at the Veterans Garden for Memorial Day.

Center – Neal Thomas reported that members participated in a rebuilding project for a home in Lincoln. The club wine tasting event went well and they raised around \$2260.00

for the Parks and Red permanent foundation. They fed around 50 people a spaghetti dinner for the Mayor's Fun Run and they also did card packs for Elliott School children. They also gave away two bicycles to Elliott Students.

University – Jolene Walker reported their geranium sales went very well this year. The annual bike ride that they sponsor had 110 participants this year. The club awards banquet and installation of officers will be held June 12th.

The Club – Bob Hillyer reported that the high school fine arts awards were presented and they would now be busy with the spring sports awards for boys and girls. The club held a member social at Pine Lake Golf Course. Bob also reported that after the high school awards banquet, a parent expressed interest in Sertoma so Bob will be following up with this person. They also had a fun program with a group of folk singers that are friends of Bob. If other clubs would be interested, they are to contact Bob.

Northeast – Fran Follett reported that they received a Gold Star Award from Lincoln Public Schools for their work with projects at Norwood Park School. During the month of May, members handed out free earplugs at two local hardware stores for Better Speech and Hearing Month. The earplugs were donated so no expense to the club.

Mid-Towne – Suzanne Frasier reported they also were very successful selling geraniums for a fundraiser. One member that was dropping membership has decided to stay so the club was grateful. Officers for the next year will be remaining the same as they are today so no installation banquet will be scheduled.

Lee again reminded everyone of important dates to remember. The International Convention will be in Denver, CO on July 18-20. The Oktoberfest is scheduled for October 9, 2008 and the last PAC meeting for this year will be June 16th.

NEW BUSINESS

Vicki Highstreet was elected to be the District Governor for the newly formed East Nebraska District. The Governor-Elect is Kay Telford from Omaha.

Vicki brought up that Lincoln would host the 2011 Regional Convention at the Holiday Inn downtown. She ask that everyone start thinking of contacts for donations, give aways,etc. It was also discussed that any funds left in the Greater Lincoln District account should be used towards convention expenses. The Greater Lincoln account will need to be closed and a new account will be created for the East Nebraska District. Funds can not be held in a District account for the convention so this money will need to be put in a Lincoln club's account to be held for the convention. It was decided to transfer the funds to the University Club since they will be the home club of the District Governor for now.

OLD BUSINESS

Lee reported that we had approved to spend \$600.00 for a hospitality room at the convention in Brainerd. This money was NOT spent as there was confusion regarding the space and there was not room for us to host a room. We will need to prepare to host a hospitality room at the 2010 convention, which will be in Minot, ND.

There being no further business, Harland Parrish made a motion to adjourn and it was seconded by Fran Follett. Meeting was adjourned at 6:20PM.
